

President's Message November 2023

I hope everyone enjoyed our unseasonably cool Summer and are busy deciding which of the many local Fall activities to attend. Please be sure to add our Fall Book sale on November 4th and 5th to your list of activities.

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, we are transitioning to email delivery of our newsletters. This change is necessary due to increasing costs of printing, folding and mailing paper copies. If you elect to receive your newsletter via email, then the cost of individual and family memberships will remain \$5.00 and \$10.00. If you feel the need to receive a paper copy, you will pay an extra \$10.00 per year for that option. You should receive a renewal notice, or you can renew online at our website.

We continue to explore different ways to generate funds to support our library. We are continuing to sell books via our bookcase in the library, periodic book sales from our book storage site, Pizza Factory lunch donations, and plan to sponsor more Saturday morning movie events. We are also evaluating other fundraising options that are appropriate for a non-profit organization. And, of course, we greatly appreciate the ongoing support provided by donations from our members and the community.

I hate to sound like a broken record, but we still desperately need a permanent facility in which to store, sort and sell books. Operating out of such a facility has traditionally been our primary source of funds (other than donations) to support the library. If you have a candidate facility or know of a possibility, please let us know so we can follow up. Our goal is to be in a new facility within the next year – sooner if we are asked to vacate our current space. Because no one in the community has stepped up to offer us a facility, we are also exploring the option of purchasing or renting a facility. In order to do that we would need to raise a significant amount of money through donations. Unfortunately, revenues from book sales are unlikely to cover rent and generate enough funds to support the library.

Election of Officers will be held at our next board meeting on Wednesday afternoon, November 15th at 1:00 in the library. Interested members are encouraged to attend and vote. We currently have 3 board openings to fill; secretary and two members at large. The other Board members and I thank you for your ongoing support, without which we could not so successfully support the library.

Closed in December Friday 12/1 - All Staff Training Day in Bakersfield Friday-Monday 12/22 through 1/1 -Winter Recess As promised in the last newsletter, our branch **Summer Reading Challenge** finisher numbers are available. In 2023, we had 353 total finishers (250 child, 24 teen, and 89 adult) compared to 247 total finishers (176 child, 19 teen, and 52 adult) in 2022. THANK YOU to those who logged reading or listening (or had us log it for you). Branch staff are happy to log for you, as long as we know how many books you read or listened to.

The Kern County Library and Kern County Aging & Adult Services are collaborating on the **Access to Technology Program** to provide education, training, and assistance on the use of technology to older adults (60 years and up) and adults with disabilities. The goal

is to connect older adults & adults with disabilities to technology and help reduce isolation, increase connections & enhance self-confidence. Appointments in Ridgecrest will primarily be virtual. A variety of services will be available, from basic computer programs and how to use your device to how to access and download apps and organize your digital photos. If you or someone you know needs help to bridge the digital divide, contact us or Kern County Aging & Adult Services to get started.

Tutoring for children and adults is available through a partnership between the Kern Literacy Council and the Kern County Library. Adults and children in need of assistance with basic education (reading, writing, math), GED preparation, English as a Second Language, or Citizenship Test preparation can sign up for an in person or virtual appointment with a volunteer tutor. We are also looking for adult volunteers to tutor at our branch. If interested, go to <u>https://kerncountylibrary.org/</u> <u>tutoring/</u> and fill out the Kern County Library's volunteer interest form AND the Kern Literacy Council's volunteer application for each branch you are willing to tutor in.

New library card designs debuted in September for Library Card Sign Up Month! We have some beautiful new designs, including some limited edition designs based on photographs taken by a Marketing staff member. Trade in your current card for a new design for \$2 or if your card is in need of replacement due to normal wear and tear, it will be free. If you use Libby or OverDrive, we will have to merge your accounts to keep your current checkouts and position in the hold queue because your card number will change.

Dominic from Senator Shannon Grove's office is in the library's Community Room once a month, on the second Tue from 1:15-3 pm. Community members have the opportunity to offer comments or ask questions about anything that her office might be able to assist with. If you know anyone who needs assistance with unemployment claims, state taxes, the DMV, or any other concerns, please have them come by. They have committed to sending someone monthly through December and will be re-evaluating to see if it is a good use of time to continue sending Dominic here.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library finally arrived in Kern County towards the end of September, thanks to the efforts of the Kern Literacy Council to secure funds to mail high quality, age appropriate books each month from birth TO age 5. Please note that mailing addresses need to be in Kern County to receive the books. Quarterly Newsletter 4 November 2023 - January 2024 Imagination Library AND our 1000 Books Before Kindergarten (which we started offering almost two years ago) can get a special Imagination Library button for their 1000 Books Before Kindergarten lanyard.

We are partnering with High Desert Training Services, who is offering the **Mission HERO** project to local small businesses. High Desert Training Services will provide training on Narcan while the library branch will provide Narcan for their small business. With the overdose numbers being high for our area, making Narcan readily available can make the difference to someone experiencing an overdose.

Reading challenges continued after the summer! The **Back to School Challenge**, which finished at the end of September had 66 finishers who read or listened to 5 hours in August and September. Children earned a Panda Express Cub meal while teens and adults were entered into a drawing for diamond painting or paint by numbers kits (and we drew 3 names).

Zip Books, the program funded by the CA State Library that allows books not available at a Kern County Library branch to be purchased via Amazon and mailed directly to the customer, recently returned! There are some stipulations on what materials can be requested. An email address is required to participate in this program that helps us build a community driven collection. Visit <u>https://kerncountylibrary.org/zipbooks/</u> for more information and the form to request something.

Two annual November card programs are happening again. The Thank-A-Vet project collects cards, letters, and coloring pages for our local veterans. Last year was the first year we were able to give them to Ridgecrest organizations and items were distributed between Alta One Federal Credit Union, the Elks Lodge, and the Ridgecrest Veterans Advisory Council for their veteran appreciation events. If you'd like to participate, drop items off by closing on November 9. Thanksgiving Cards for Seniors through a partnership with local moms group MAEVE Ridgecrest returns. Thanksgiving cards will be delivered to Bella Sera this year. (Note: they deliver Easter and Thanksgiving cards and alternate between Bella Sera and High Desert Haven.) If you'd like to participate in the Thanksgiving Cards for Seniors project, bring them by noon on November 22. For both projects, I've set up some library programs with supplies for people to come and make cards so check our calendar for dates and times.

Our current reading challenge offers incentives for participating in the existing **Adventure 365 Challenge** in Beanstack. Through the end of the year (Dec 22), kids will earn a Panda Express Cub meal for every 10 books read or listened to from October 18. (Coupons expire 12/31/23 so pick them up before we close for Winter Recess.) Teens and adults will be entered into a drawing for a diamond painting or paint by numbers kit.

As the holidays and the end of the year approach, it's generally a time to reflect on the past year of successes and learning experiences, be grateful for the support we've received, and look forward to what is coming in the future. Our branch has seen a lot of success this year and we have also had some learning experiences. We've had growth in some areas and will be making some changes. We appreciate the support we received this past summer (outlined in the previous newsletter) and we continue to be grateful for having amazingly wonderful financial and programming support. Looking to the future, we will continue to do our best to meet the needs of our community as we are able. Keep an eye on our calendars for more adult programs that we will try offering to determine the interest. If you have suggestions for programs (for any age group), please let us know and we will do our best to accommodate when we can. If you have a skill that you would like to share with our community, such as crochet, chess, art, or crafts, please let us know.
