

President's Message August 2025

Book Store – On June 1st, the Friends initiated a one year lease on a store front at 1513 N. Norma, just North of the former Sizzler restaurant. As you may recall, this was necessitated because we lost use of our facility at the North Albertsons shopping center. With a lot of volunteer labor, we built an interior wall, cleaned and painted the floor, installed lots of shelving/displays, and filled the store with inventory. We had a grand opening on June 27th and 28th, then started our "regular" hours (10am - 2pm, Wed. through Sat.) on July 9th after the holiday. The store name of "Books & More" was selected because the store not only offers books, but also has art work and nice thrift shop items. Board member, Julie Gervais has graciously agreed to be the manager of the store. So, stop by, say hello, shop, and let us know what you think of the new store.

Although this store allows us to continue to sell donated books, we still do not have a solution to our book storage needs. And, the profitability of the store is uncertain at this early stage. However, based upon initial sales, we are very optimistic.

Volunteers -- I am amazed at all of the support we have gotten from the community, FRBL members, and even a few non-members. The list of everyone that helped set up the store is so long, it would take up most of this newsletter to list them all. Plus, if I tried to publish the list here, I would certainly miss a few names. The store's initial non-book inventory was donated by board members and local artists. We have over 30 volunteers signed up to "run the cash register" four days each week. (We require at least two volunteers be present in the store during open hours.) I am not only amazed, but grateful for all of this support.

Donations & Fundraisers – On July 21st, the Friends sponsored a Movie (How to Train Your Dragon) at the Ridgecrest Cinema. The theater generously allows us to keep all ticket sales and donates a portion of concession stand receipts. Thanks to Ridgecrest Cinemas, Julie Gervais, and Nani Banks for making this happen.

I am not sure if opening the new store is a factor, but we have recently received several large donations, which are reflected in the "expanded" donor list at the end of this newsletter. You can add to these funds by going to our website at https://www.ridgecrestfriends.org and clicking on the large "Donate" button. Or, you can mail or drop off a check made payable to FRBL at the Library, 131 East Las Flores Ave.

Your Board of Directors continues to work with fellow board member Kim Metcalf to create a fundraising event in the Fall. This will include a catered dinner and fun activities. Stay tuned for more information as we approach cooler Fall weather.

Thanks -- Again, thank you to all who support the Friends with their time, money, and muscles. Because of this support, we now have an operational store that will hopefully produce additional funds to help the library, and we are exceeding our fund raising goals for the year.

While the Summer Reading Challenge officially ended on July 31, we give people a couple of weeks to pick up their finisher bags and pick out their finisher books, so the next newsletter will include the Summer Reading Challenge finisher numbers. For now, here's a recap **Lunch at the Library** and some of the amazing **performances** we have brought to our community.

We have had a wonderful summer filled with nourishment for bodies through **Lunch at the Library!** Our continued partnership with Sierra Sands Unified School District provided lunch for 22 days this summer, free to all 18 and under! We served 1,866 lunches to children (an average of 84.8 lunches per day we offered lunch) with 2,651 people attending. We were fortunate to have grant funds for two summer hires along with 7 amazing volunteers who volunteered 156.5 hours with Lunch at the Library. For the first time since we started Lunch at the Library (in 2018) we had a visitor during every lunch. The vehicle visits from **Waste Management's recycle truck, Liberty Ambulance, Ridgecrest Police Department, and Kern County Fire Department Station** 84 drew large crowds, as expected.





This summer, we also nourished minds through our Summer Reading Challenge performances for our community and a great variety of "regular" programs for all ages from babies through adults. Lunch at the Library grant funding allowed us to have the always popular Wild Man Dan return with a variety of reptiles and information. New this summer and made possible with Lunch at the Library grant funds were: electric violinist Cara-C (who played songs for children and adults), High Desert Falconry (who brought a Eurasian eagle owl, peregrine falcon, and a Harris hawk for education and a flight demo with the hawk), and Firelight Shadow Theater (who put on a fun and educational shadow puppet show incorporating a handful of audience members). The Friends of the Kern County Library, Inc. sent The Magic of Josiah back to all of the open branches, where this summer's performance included a real, live rabbit for the first time!

Omnipresent Puppet Theater put on an entertaining performance of The Tortoise and the Hare and was sponsored by Ridge Writers.(Don will work on a new show for summer 2026!)

We finished the summer with a new event and a returning experience sponsored by the **Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library**. *[continued on page 4]*



New this summer was **Golden Meadow Goats**, who brought four baby goats (two were two days old and two were two weeks old but two weeks premature). Attendees were able to spend some quality time with these baby goats (and the security bunnies) and it was an enjoyable experience for all.

Magic Napoleon returned and, as always, put on a wonderful

magic and bubble show filled with audience participation and interaction before creating balloon sculptures for all who wanted one.

We remain incredibly

grateful for the support of the FRBL members that helps us bring so many different experiences to our community! Thank you, for doing your part to support the FRBL and in turn, the Ridgecrest Branch Library.

Attending programs and participating in the **Summer Reading Challenge** is another way to support the library, and it was nice to see familiar FRBL faces in attendance at big and small programs and choosing their finisher books.
