

President's Message

BOOK SALE -- We just completed our very successful Spring Book Sale. Preparation, setup, and teardown required a tremendous amount of volunteer labor. I want to thank everyone that bought books and all those wonderful volunteers that made the sale possible. We greatly appreciate each and everyone of you. You are the reason we are able to support the library.

BOOK FACILITY -- We continue to search for an affordable facility that meets our requirements. We have found many vacant spaces available in Ridgecrest that would meet our requirements. However, the cost to rent or purchase any of those spaces is far too high for our modest budget. We recently identified a great possibility that would meet our requirement for a storefront in which we can sort, display and sell books. However, storage space at that facility is minimal. We hope to gain access to this space by the end of the year and begin selling books on a weekly basis. This would allow us to resume accepting limited book donations. We will continue to search for an affordable storage space. Although operating from two locations is less desirable than a single facility, it should be easier to find a storage space because there will not be a need for easy customer access and parking. If any of you are aware of possible facilities, please let us know.

DONATIONS -- As you know, most of the funds that we use to support the library come from book sales and donations. Our donations have dropped off in the past few years. The graph shows how donations have gone down over the past 5 years. 2019 was exceptional in that we received a large donation from the Starr family. A few generous donors kept donations at a



healthy level through 2022. Then we saw a big drop in 2023. The amount shown for 2024 is for a partial year, so we hope it will be better that 2023 and reverse this trend. Our expenses will likely increase as we transition to new facilities that will require that we pay utilities and possibly rent and/or maintenance costs. So, donations will be even more important. To better recognize those that provide significant donations, I have added a new section to the newsletter. *[p. 6].* Perhaps this section will remind us all to make a donation to the Friends. By the way, if you wish to donate now, please send a check or log onto our website (Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library (ridgecrestfriends.org) to donate via credit card, debit card or bank transfer.

READING AID – A patron donated a Merlin Enhanced Vision Video Magnifier. This device sits on a table or desk and projects a magnified color image of a book or document onto a 21" screen. These sell new for \$2000 to \$4000. The library does not have sufficient space for this device. So, we want to make it available (hopefully for a modest donation) to someone with poor vision. Please let us know of anyone in need of such a device. *[continued on Page 3]*

Remember that Kern County Libraries are funded at a level that is less than 20% of the median funding in California. That is why the support provided by the Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library is so very, very important.

We are approaching another fun (and busy) summer and are excited to continue to serve our community by providing programs and ways to connect people with information, ideas, and each other.

Narcan continues to be available for FREE at **ALL** Kern County Library branches when they are open. Stop by to get some for your first aid kit because anyone taking an opioid can suffer from an overdose.Our partnership with High Desert Training Services has helped expand accessibility in our community to those who attend their training sessions or outreach events.

ValleyCat Mobile App IS BACK! You can use it again or download it if you did not have it before or if you deleted it when we said it wasn't working and we weren't getting it back.

The **Kern Public Health Mobile Health Clinic** is here monthly in the lot next to the library with routine child and adult immunizations, family planning services including IUD and implants, STD testing/treatment (chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis, HIV), and TB interviews and QuantiFERON blood draws for TB testing. They **DO NOT** offer sick visits, injury assessments, chronic disease management (asthma, diabetes, heart disease or high blood pressure), or cancer screenings. Appointments are NOT needed but can be made by calling 661-321-3000.

Beanstack is our reading challenge tracker software. Please participate to help our branch finisher numbers! If you don't want to log online, let us know and we can log it for you. You do not need to use library materials (though doing so helps our circulation numbers to keep us the third busiest branch in the system). For our *Color of the Month* challenge, read or listen to a book with a cover that is primarily the color of the month. May is black, June is purple, July is white, and August is orange. We also create a small display for ideas. *Spring Into Reading* asks for 135 minutes to be read or listened to in April and May.

The **Summer Reading Challenge** is to read or listen to 10 books or for 10 hours. Ridgecrest has consistently had good adult participation and we want to keep it that way! Don't forget that we can log it for you. Bring in a list (your due date receipt works great) and staff can log on Beanstack.

The **Building Forward Library Infrastructure Grant** administered by the California State Library awarded \$12.8 million for safety upgrades and infrastructure improvements to the Kern County Library system from Budget Act of 2021, Senate Bill 129. We were awarded just over \$1 million with proposed improvements:replacement of door and window glass, installation of a security system, lighting and HVAC updates, and concrete repair. Anticipated project dates are April 2025 through November 2025 with scope

and timing subject to change. [continued on Page 4]

Stay & Play has been successful and we are in the second six-week series. We purchased more items to encourage imagination, interaction, and early literacy concepts, with our newest and biggest item being a Create-It Station! It is currently a bakery but we have plans to make it into a grocery store, veterinary office, restaurant, doctor's office, and farmer's market. We connected caregivers to these resources: services for families (Jay Nolan and Oasis Family Resource Center), car seat safety, burn and scald prevention education, hands-only CPR, nutrition, pediatric occupational therapy, vision screener, dental tips, stress management, Kern Regional Center, and Community Connection for Childcare.

Summer Reading Challenge (already mentioned) is our biggest and busiest time of the year! We remain grateful to the Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library for providing most of the funds for the multiple programs we are offering every day and for two of the big performances this summer. The Friends of the Kern County Library Inc. and Lunch at the Library grant will also provide several big performances this. If you want to support us directly, check out our Amazon Wish List and purchase supplies for upcoming programs. Items currently on the list are for our popular scavenger hunt (we have a monthly theme and a weekly list to look for with a small prize for completion) and our summer programs (for these crafts: wind chimes, zen gardens, no sew caterpillars, and journals along with sand mandalas, farm, and butterfly crafts).

Lunch at the Library returns thanks to our partnership with Sierra Sands Unified School District. Everyone 18 and under can get a FREE lunch (\$5 for adults) from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm on Tuesdays through Fridays from 6/6 through 7/12, no questions asked.

Zip Books continues through June 2024 as funds last. Library cardholders can request up to 5 print books at a time that are **NOT** owned by ANY Kern County Library branch to help build a community driven collection. Books are sent to the patron's home via Amazon at no cost. When finished, the patron **returns the books to library staff**. We have a **collection box for plastic bags and plastic wrap** through mid-Feb 2025 to help the Ridgecrest Lions Club collect 1,000 lbs. of plastic to place a bench near the veterans memorial park at the Sgt. John Pinney Pool Complex. Drop off **CLEAN** plastic bags and wrap any time the library is open (Tue-Thu 10 am to 7 pm, Fri 10 am to 6 pm, and Sat 10 am to 4 pm). Bring in your grocery bags, produce bags, newspaper bags, plastic overwrap on cases of bottled water/paper towels/toilet paper, shipping envelopes, bubble wrap, air pillows, and bread bags (please empty crumbs first). As always, we **appreciate you all** because FRBL funds enable us to provide all of the different programs that we offer the community. I have heard multiple times from different sources that our Kern County libraries provide more programming than other larger libraries with larger budgets. We currently offer something for someone (primarily youth) to do every day that we are open and often have multiple programs every day. We have been trying to offer more programs for adults as requested, but haven't been able to find a good day and time or activity yet with "good" attendance, so feel free to share any ideas. We hope to see **YOU** using the library this summer!
